The faculty member in this position will provide leadership in revision of the Geology minor. He or she will have the opportunity to develop upper level Geology courses that may be targeted at students interested in any of the following: the Geology Minor, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, or Sustainability. A candidate with expertise in GIS with environmental applications is preferred. Participation in the college's foundational common course, Liberal Arts and Sciences 200, is expected and there is opportunity for participation in other interdisciplinary courses.
